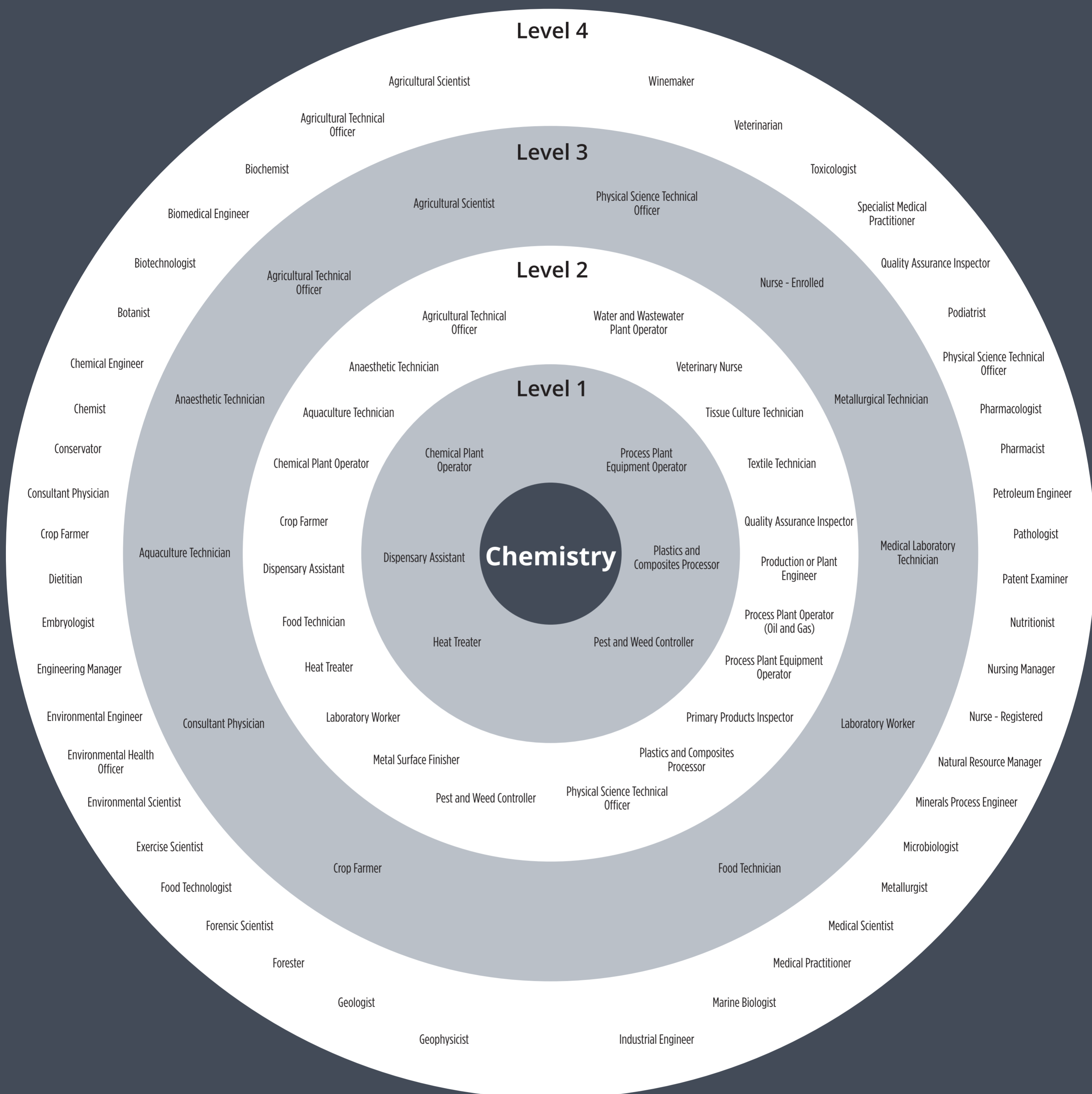


# Do you enjoy or are you good at **Chemistry**?



## Training levels and requirements

### Level 1

Usually has a skill level equal to the completion of Year 10, the Senior Certificate of Education, Certificate I or II. Australian Apprenticeships maybe offered at this level.

### Level 2

Usually has a skill level equal to a Certificate III or IV or at least three years relevant experience. Australian Apprenticeships maybe offered at this level.

### Level 3

Usually requires a level of skill equal to a Diploma or Advance Diploma. Study is often undertaken through TAFEs or Register Training Organisations. Some universities offer studies at this level.

### Level 4

Usually requires a level of skill equal to a Bachelor Degree or higher qualification. Study is often undertaken at a university.

This chart shows a selection of occupations that have some relation to the subject of **Chemistry**. The four education and training levels are to be used as a guide only. These levels indicate the most common education and/or entry requirements for these jobs.
